**Welcome to St. John's Citadel!** As you worship with us today may you experience the presence and power of Christ in a meaningful way.


This morning we will continue the passion series on the Suffering Servant -- Jesus Christ. The prophet Isaiah (50:4-8), in depicting the Messiah's determination to complete the redemptive task, says that the Servant feels no shame or disgrace because of the persecution and torment of His adversaries. Rather, He sets His face like a flint; He endures all, knowing that the Sovereign Lord is there to help Him, and that all the nations will reap the benefits. The truth is, of course, that we are all unworthy of this work of God on our behalf.

Our theme tonight will centre around judgment. Accepting the work of Christ as the Suffering Servant means that our names will be written in the Lamb's Book of Life. Rejecting His redemptive work, however, guarantees our presence before the Great White Throne, as described in Revelation 20. Unfortunately, this rejection (and eminent judgment) also ensures that we will be shut out of heaven and assigned a place in the lake of fire.

A special thank you to everyone who supported the benefit concert for the Mission to Haiti, and to those who have donated funds or given supplies.
